District Judge Clement Seah Chi-Ling State Courts of Singapore

District Judge Clement Seah Chi-Ling is the Principal District Judge of the Civil Courts Cluster of the State Courts of Singapore.

DJ Seah graduated from the National University of Singapore with a Bachelor of Laws degree (First Class Honours). He thereafter joined the Singapore Legal Service, first as a Justices' Law Clerk for the Singapore Court of Appeal, followed by a stint as an Assistant Registrar of the Singapore High Court. In 2001, he obtained a Master of Laws degree from Harvard Law School. He thereafter spent nine years as a corporate lawyer in the Singapore office of a leading American law firm, and the Shanghai office of a Magic Circle firm.

DJ Seah re-joined the Singapore Legal Service as a district judge in 2011.
