CAPSULE BIOGRAPHY

Dr. Han-Wei Liu took on the role of Associate Professor of Law at the Yong Pung How School of Law at Singapore Management University (SMU) in July 2023. Prior to his position at SMU, he served as a Senior Lecturer (tenured) at Monash University in Australia and an Assistant Professor of Law (tenure-track) at National Tsing Hua University in Taiwan. Professor Liu's teaching and research interests lie in financial regulations, law and technology, and international economic law. Before he ventured into academia, Professor Liu gained invaluable practical experience in the legal field by working at prominent law firms such as Baker & McKenzie and Russin & Vecchi, where he specialized in financial regulations and complex dispute resolution.

Dr. Liu's academic credentials include a Ph.D., *summa cum laude*, from the Graduate Institute, Geneva (IHEID), which he pursued on a Kathryn Davis Scholarship. He also holds master's degrees from Columbia Law School and Oxford University, funded by the Taiwan Government Scholarship and the British Chevening Scholarship. His LL.M. and LL.B. degrees were obtained from National Chengchi University.

His work appears or is forthcoming in top-rated law journals, such as *Harvard International Law Journal*, *University of Pennsylvania Journal of International Law*, *Cornell International Law Journal*, *Georgetown Journal of International Law*, *Journal of International Economic Law*, *International Journal of Law and Information Technology*, *Melbourne Journal of International Law*, *Journal of World Trade*, *Sydney Law Review* and *UNSW Law Journal*. Professor Liu presented his work at conferences held by universities, among others, Cambridge, Columbia, Duke, Groningen, Luxembourg, Melbourne, Singapore Management University, UNSW, and Warwick. He also held visiting posts at Harvard Law School, Columbia Law School, National Taiwan University, and Melbourne Law School.

Dr. Liu received several research grants from Taiwan's Ministry of Science and Technology and Ministry of Economic Affairs and has advised high-tech firms (e.g., LINE (Taiwan)), think tanks (e.g., Industrial Technology Research Institute, Taiwan), and international organizations (e.g., Asian Development Bank) on regulations of digital communication, cross-border data flow, and technology transfer/export control issues. Han-Wei's works on digital trade governance have been cited by the *Australian Productivity Commission*, *Australian Law Reform Commission*, *Singaporean Personal Data Protection Commission*, *Policy Research Institute of Japan's Ministry of Finance*, *World Bank*, *UN Economic and Social Commission for Asia and the Pacific*, and used by experts in the testimony before US Congress. He was also invited by the Australian Law Reform Commission to attend a consultation with other leading Australian academics concerning the proposed reform for financial services regulation. Currently, Dr. Liu is the Co-Chair of the American Society of International Law's International Law & Technology Interest Group and Associate Editor of the *Journal of World Trade*.
