Heng Wang is a Professor and a former Associate Dean (Faculty Matters & Research) at Yong Pung How School of Law, Singapore Management University. Prior to this, he was a professor at University of New South Wales, Sydney where he was a co-director of two major research centres. He has received major grants and awards, including being named Australia's research field leader in international law by *The Australian* newspaper.

His work is often cited in intergovernmental organisation documents. He serves on the Advisory Group of a United Nation institution specializing in technology. He is also a member of the World Economic Forum's AI Governance Alliance, Future of Blockchain and Digital Assets Initiative, and the AI in Financial Services Initiative.
