Professor Nadja Alexander is Academic Director of the Singapore International Dispute Resolution Academy and Professor of Law at the Singapore Management University.

Nadja is an internationally recognised thought leader in mediation and dispute systems design with Who's Who Legal ranking her as one of the Global Elite in the ADR field. She is an award winning author and educator. She has advised international bodies, such as the World Bank Group, and national governments in Europe, Asia, Australia and Africa on mediation policy. She also sits on international mediation panels in Singapore (SIMC), Hong Kong (HKMAAL) and Australia (MSB) and practises in the English and German languages. Nadja has been engaged in the field of conflict resolution in more than 30 countries.

Nadja is on the Advisory Board of the Vienna International Arbitration Centre and a board member of the Singapore International Mediation Institute. She is also a Senior Fellow of the Dispute Resolution Institute at Mitchell Hamline School of Law, United States of America and Honorary Professor at the University of Queensland, Australia.
